IHSPA Summer Editors' Workshop
June 10 - 13

With top-notch instructors and a curriculum based on teambuilding and leadership skills, your student editors will learn how to lead their staffs toward a successful 2002 - 2003.

Let's face it, they don't miss deadlines, take poor photos, or publish sub-par stories because you're a bad teacher. They do so because they compromise their standards, don't know how to train new staff members, and fail to handle staff conflicts. They're young, and they're learning how to be leaders.

Cost

The state associaton’s journalism workshop has been designed to provide an optimum experience at a reasonable price, \$225 per student for 4 activity-packed days. The workshop fee includes meals and air-conditioned door accommodations.

Format

The IHSPA workshop does not focus on individual publications skills -- such as basic reporting, photography, and computer design. Please do not send students who are new to staff or who aren’t serious about the high school’s publication. You should only send your top-notch, experienced editors. Their Franklin experience will begin with people skills: working with diverse personalities, fostering a team atmosphere, working as a partner with the adviser, and conflict management. Then, they move to teaching / leadership skills every editor should know. Finally, your editors practice their team skills. In one day, groups of four students will pull together a story package of professional quality while relying on each other to perform specific duties.

To ensure the workshop draws only students who occupy the top leadership positions on your staff, IHSPA is limiting registrations to three students per staff -- not per school.
